



Within 2020 – 2021, SOF got connected with VOICE Network Bangladesh.

This time we are working with Child Rights and Safeguards project which is mainly to prevent child trafficking and we are very happy to announce that we made a documentary about child trafficking. Moreover, we worked in a research based project which is The Gendered Price of Precarity Project. Also, we made a documentary on work place sexual harassment, which is such an achievement for us. Moreover, SOF got connected with Tavola Valdese within this period. SOF also involved nationally with the claiming our voice Beijing + 25 review and follow up.

The organization also actively participated in an EU-TDH mega project, such as Ekotai Morjada funded by European Union & co-funded by Terre des Homes Italy. The organization has integrated gender equity strategy in designing and implementing programs. Women empowerment will continue to be the cornerstone of our future programs where women rights and gender equality issues will be addressed more comprehensively and with rigor. This report is a product of the combined efforts of all SOF staff. I gratefully acknowledge the contributions of the staff for their persistent efforts. SOF also feels very proud that it existed for the last 15 years very successfully with improved learning. I also hope to see SOF flourish more in the future, and for that I seek help from all quarters.

About Us

In 2005 Shobujer Ovijan Foundation has formed as a brainchild of a group of young women which is envisioned as a non-political woman headed organization that will serve the women and child at risk to any form of exploitation. The Ovijan (expedition) has initially starts in form of volunteer works and supporting the vulnerable women and children to connect with opportunities available through informal capacity enhancement activities. Later in 2012 Shobujer Ovijan Foundation has received the needful registration to receive foreign funds directly.

Shobujer Ovijan Foundation works to enhance the resilience of the working women and their children through the facilitation of collective movement and capacity building initiatives. Shobujer Ovijan Foundation has started working with women contributing to the global value chain of readymade garments and their children, later expanded their areas and operation and included intervention for domestic workers, sex workers, transgender communities, adolescent girls, women from ethnic communities, women from vulnerable communities. Shobujer Ovijan Foundation facilitate the women to learn about their rights and entitlements and to raise their voice collectively and systematically so that could be heard. The major interventions of SOF includes- education programme for children, leadership programme for young women, violence against women programme, child welfare (labour/trafficking) programme. Apart from mobilizing the grassroot women and institutions, SOF do needful evidence generation as their contribution to the national level feminist movements for policy changes.

Apart from periodic interventions and supporting the feminist movements Shobujer Ovijan Foundation have services like Shishu Bikash Kenrda (Day Care) designed especially for the women working in the RMG factories but open to all the children from the nearby vulnerable communities. Women Café is another service-oriented initiative by Shobujer Ovijan Foundation, where women can refresh themselves and can discuss about the challenges they are facing in their workplace and their family. The café also provides the opportunity to the women to seek legal advice and support if necessary.

Vision

SOF envisions a society where all children and women enjoy secure, healthy, enlightened lives and responsive environment that promote their social, economic, cultural and moral development.


Mission

EkotayMorjada – Unity for Dignity Project

This project is funded by the **European Union (EU)** and supported by **Terre Des Homes Italia**, the project period is from 1st January 2020 to 31st December 2022. The project's overall objective is to promote inclusive and sustainable economic growth through the realization of the decent work agenda for domestic garment workers in the capital of Bangladesh. Through inclusive and more effective civil society action, the project will collectivize and empower lots of domestic and RMG workers, i.e., women working in different garment factories and households to increase their access to entitlements and better working conditions to realize the decent work agenda ultimately.

Besides, wide-ranging campaigns and mass awareness rising on worker rights and entitlements will reach many people. The action recognizes that economic growth depends on having better living standards, access to social protection and entitlements, more equal power dynamics in the workplace, and higher wages, which will lead to more motivated and productive workers and fewer industrial accidents.

The key aspects of the decent work agenda to be addressed in this action include:

- ✓ Enhanced recognition and respect for the rights of workers, and in particularly disadvantaged workers who need representation, participation, and laws and policies that protect and defend their rights;
- ✓ Promoting dialogue, involving strong and independent workers' and employers' organizations to increasing productivity, avoid disputes at work and building more constructive relationships between workers and employers;
- ✓ Activate and reactivate the committee in RMG workers with collaboration with garments owner, especially the anti-harassment committee;

- ✓ Quarterly DCC parents' meetings at factory and community level daycare center to ensure better environment for the children;
- ✓ Established worker groups with our beneficiaries' awareness and rights;
- ✓ Provide direct health support to workers and children at our two women's café and daycare center;
- ✓ Provide network and referral to health/legal aid service providers.

Sponsorship Program


This project is sponsored by Terre Des Homes Italy. The duration of this project is March 2019—continue. The coverage area of this project is Sattola Slum, Mohakhali, Dhaka. Here, SOF has established a SBK center where there are studying 123children.

The full form of SBK is ShishuBikash Kendra. Currently, two teachers are working here. However, a drawing teacher teaches drawing all the students regularly.

The SBK center is open 5 days in a week. There are mainlytwo shifts in terms of classes, one is from 10am - 12pm and other one is from 2:30pm - 4:30pm.

Activities of SBK Center:

- ✓ ECD Support is given to all 123 children.
- ✓ Different learning activities are done.
- ✓ Raising awareness in different social issues.
- ✓ Educational support to children.
- ✓ Drawing, songs and rhymes teaching by teachers.
- ✓ Monthly parents meetings.
- ✓ Quarterly CBO meetings.
- ✓ Providing reading materials.
- ✓ Providing hygienity.
- Providing health care support.

South Asia Young Women's Leadership and Mentoring Initiative - Phase II

This project is funded by the **Global Fund for Women (GFW)**. This project's central theme is to develop young women leaders who will lead different movements, especially on women's issues. After training, one Young Women Leader (YWL) will train up ten young women. Similarly, each of these ten young women disseminates their training in further ten young women.

The project is headed by the Indian Organization 'Crea'. A total of ten organizations, including SOF, are working on this project. All the mentors and YWL sit for a monthly online meeting. In the meeting, they used to share their problems, learnings and also discuss the solutions of their problems. This project includes another session named 'One to One Session'. In this session, the mentor and the YWL discuss their findings and problems and also the solutions.

SOF trains young leaders and their friends to reduce domestic violence in the community by creating awareness. There are the 14 leaders created by SOF in MohakhaliSattola Slum, who also spread their learning to others. End of the year, we got 140 leaders who were created from these 14 young leaders. They are now aware of steps against domestic violence. When domestic violence occurs in the slum area they first try to solve it with the help of the community leaders. If it does not work then they go to the counselor or commissioner.

Securing Garments Workers

This project is funded by Global Fund for Women (GFW). Besides, this project has started on September 2020 and it will be ended by September 2022.

Goals of this project are:

- ✓ Garments factory wise safety and occupational health assessment
- ✓ Advocacy with the factory management, industry association, regulatory authorities and international buyers.
- ✓ Capacity building of factory management, Workers on safety and occupational health.
- ✓ Employers of RMG will be more aware of workers' rights and employment after the primary dialogue.
- ✓ Women workers will be able to take important decisions by taking the opportunity of life - based education and expressing their views. They will also be able to create a conducive working environment for them and speak out against the abuse and exploitation of women.

Child Rights and Safeguards project

This project is funded by Global Fund for Children (GFC). This project has started on December 2020 and it will end by January 2023. The coverage area of this project is Kallaynpur Slum, Mirpur, Dhaka, and Sattlo Slum, Mohakhali, Dhaka.

Moreover, in December 2021, we made a documentary on Child Trafficking. Besides, we also made a change maker team.

Major Program Focus:

- ✓ Carry out awareness campaign on child rights and safe guard issues
- ✓ Increase awareness among the individuals living in the slum areas of Dhaka city to prevent Child Trafficking.
- ✓ Provide regular counselling to the selected child and their families.
- ✓ Formed change maker group who will work for prevention of child trafficking, gender-based violence & abuse, early marriage/ child marriage, child labor etc.
- ✓ Arranging employment opportunities for the trafficked children
- ✓ To raise awareness among the people living in slum areas of Dhaka city to combat with Covid 19.



The Aim of BIGD is to promote an equitable as prosperous society by informing policies and programs based on relevant, high quality research. Moreover, their research focus is on identifying solution of effective scale-up of program and policies.

Over the years, BIGD has developed an extensive knowledge base in four broad thematic areas-economic development and growth; governance and policies; gender and social transformation; ad urban; climate change and environment.

One of the intensive activities which is taken by us is we have successfully made a documentary based on sexual harassment in the workplace.

Major Program Focus:

- ✓ Increase awareness in the project area to prevent COVID-19.
- ✓ Provide financial assistance to the victims of violence during COVID-19.
- ✓ Provide personal Hygiene products and materials.
- ✓ Introduce alternative income source.
- ✓ Conduct research.

SOF has been working different cases with International Social Service (ISS) since 2019. SOF does the field visit of cases assigned by ISS country representatives. After visits ShobujerOvijan prepares a report about the queries asked by International Social Services. In the past year of July 2019-June 2020 SOF has been connected with 4 cases. Even Mahmuda Begum, Executive Director of SOF was present at a court hearing.
